

Nine brands celebrate PHL’s creative culture in Maison & Objet Paris



Nine premier home and fashion brands are set to demonstrate the Philippines’ creative heritage in the upcoming Maison et Objet Paris on September 8 – 12, featuring a diverse collection of design and lifestyle products inspired by the vibrant sceneries and picturesque landscape of the country’s 7,641 islands.

Maison & Objet Paris is the premier French trade fair for interior design held biannually on January and September. Held in alongside the Paris Design Week, the five-day event is one of the three most important European events for interior design.

With the theme ‘Common Ground,’ nine brands will feature products that are fragments of the Philippine creative culture—a manifestation the country’s unrelenting ardor for craftsmanship, a repertoire of modern influences, and an evolving style sense.

“The DesignPHILIPPINES Pavilion will be an appreciation of the country’s rich culture and creative influences using panoramic juxtapositions of product and landscapes,” said CITEM Executive Director Clayton Tugonon.

Nine Philippine brands featured in Maison & Objet are:

1. Agsam Fashion Fern Accesories



With expertise from a 40-year-old weaving tradition, Agsam creates beautifully handwoven fashion accessories to showcase the ingenuity and craftsmanship of the indigenous women in the mountains of Surigao del Sur, Philippines. Thus, providing a sustainable livelihood for these women.

The *agsam* plant material is collected, washed and cut into strips by Surigao del Sur tribespeople. They will then deliver the *agsam* material to the group of indigenous women, who shall begin its skillful and precise weaving to produce beautifully handcrafted fashion pieces.

2. Beatriz



Beatriz presents a vibrant abstraction of the tropical theme with a capsule series of casual cuffs and clutch bags. Exotic tropical flora and fauna is evoked through the collection's vivid spectrum that includes bright yellow, tangerine, mysterious purple, indigo, and aqua. The scenography of the tropical forests is expressed through the vivid colors and geometric shapes.

3. Catalina Embroideries



Catalina creates elegant and stylish decór, perfect for your home. They care deeply about the environment; only natural materials found in the Philippines, such as shell, coco, rattan, and the like are used to make their products. Each item is carefully made by hand by their skilled craftsmen. Every product is perfectly hand-loomed, with only the best quality in mind.
