



EXCUSE MY FRENCH!

What do first lady Brigitte Macron, choreographer Benjamin Millepied and the singer Christine and the Queens have in common... apart from the fact that they are all French? According to Vincent Grégoire from the Paris-based forecasting agency NellyRodi, they also possess a certain je ne sais quoi — that indescribable Gallic quality that exudes an easy allure, an effortless chic and a distinctive sense of style.





THIS INSPIRATION WAS WHAT MADE MAISON & OBJET PICK THE THEME OF THIS YEAR: EXCUSE MY FRENCH!

The topic chosen for January 2019 may have a humorous note to it: "Excuse My French!" but, it looks very seriously at a re-emergence of the country of Molière on the international scene. "There's a renewed curiosity about the French abroad, a sort of fascination at the moment", asserts Grégoire. For him, the movement is linked to globalization: "In a world where things are becoming standardized, people are looking for something different". And where better to celebrate that than at MAISON&OBJET, the Parisian trade show par excellence? Foreign visitors will be given the opportunity to discover new French brands and designers, while others will better understand how to take full advantage of the Made in France phenomenon.


The country has long been a reference world - wide for the arts, fashion, design and lifestyle. For many, it is quite simply the epitome of elegance .

The importance of the French tech industry should not be underestimated either . Paris is home to the world's largest start -up campus, Station F, and Gallic firms are leading players in fields of new technology that are bringing revolu - tionary changes in the home. 



SEBASTIAN HERKNER





A DESIGNER WHO STRADLES THE BOUNDARY BETWEEN MODERNITY AND TRADITION

At 37, German designer Sebastian Herkner, who trained at Offenbach University of Art and Design, is embarking on an ever-growing number of collaborations with international design houses, and over the course of the past decade has received some thirty awards in recognition of his innovative yet traditional work.

Since first setting up his studio in the Frankfurt suburb of Offenbach am Main back in 2006, Sebastian Herkner has unremittingly focused on creating designs that fuse tradition with creativity, new technology with craftsmanship. He had adopted this style way before the design world took it under its wing in a supremely fashionable wave.

His unconditional love for traditional craftsmanship was what guided his first landmark design, the "Bell" table, whose steel and brass platter nestles on a

hand-blown glass base produced in a centuries-old Bavarian glass factory

AN EYE FOR COLOUR

His appetite for a challenge and relentless desire to explore unchartered territory has not only led him to design glasses, bicycles and perfume bottles or make forays into the world of interior design, but also to embark on an internship with Stella McCartney during the course of his studies. "I was interested in the manufacturing processes used in fashion, and understanding how colours are put together" he explains. The flair for combining colours he honed whilst there now underpins his signature style.

"Colour is often the very last thing designers think about. For me, it's always the starting point for the whole design process". He does admit, nonetheless, that "it can take years to find that perfect colour combination".

Be it in his studio, surrounded by a six -strong team that herald from all four corners of the world, or during his frequent trips to China, Colombia, Thailand, Senegal and Canada visiting local manufacturers, design houses and craftsmen, Sebastian Herkner has a longstanding habit of quenching his thirst for ideas elsewhere. "Different cultures, skills and lifestyles all fuel my inspiration" he explains. He also finds his inspiration in traditional materials - ceramics, leather, marble.... And art.

Every single source of inspiration is perfectly in tune with his quest for authenticity, his desire to use sustainable materials, and his sense of respect for the time it takes to create a truly stunning piece. His approach to design is both ethical and committed, imbuing the creative process with the same degree of importance as the actual end product itself.





Cathédrale Notre Dame de Paris

Paris' most visited unticketed site, with upwards of 14 million visitors per year, is a masterpiece of French Gothic architecture. If you love design and architecture, then Paris is the right city to visit, especially during January, when design events flood the streets. Visiting the Notre Dame should definitely be on your bucket list as it is nothing short of a masterpiece.

Musée d'Orsay

The home of France's national collection from the impressionist, postimpressionist and art nouveau movements spanning from 1848 to 1914 is the glorious former Gare d'Orsay railway station – itself an art nouveau showpiece – where a roll-call of masters and their world-famous works are on display.

Jardin du Luxembourg

This inner-city oasis of formal terraces, chestnut groves and lush lawns has a special place in Parisians' hearts.

Napoléon dedicated the 23 gracefully laid-out hectares of the Luxembourg Gardens to the children of Paris, and many residents spent their childhood right here. Such beautiful gardens can't be missed during your visit to Paris.



Basilique du Sacré-Cœur

Begun in 1875 in the wake of the Franco-Prussian War and the chaos of the Paris Commune, Sacré-Cœur is a symbol of the former struggle between the conservative Catholic old guard and the secular, republican radicals. It was finally consecrated in 1919, standing in contrast to the bohemian lifestyle that surrounded it. The view over Paris from its parvis is breathtaking.





Centre Pompidou

Renowned for its radical architectural statement, the 1977-opened Centre Pompidou brings together galleries and cutting-edge exhibitions, hands-on workshops, dance performances, cinemas and other entertainment venues, with street performers and fanciful fountains outside. The Musée National d'Art Moderne, France's national collection of art dating from 1905 onward, is the main draw. Don't miss the spectacular Parisian panorama from the rooftop.

Canal St-Martin

The tranquil, 4.5km-long Canal St-Martin was inaugurated in 1825 to provide a shipping link between the Seine and Paris' northeastern suburbs. Emerging from below ground near place de la République, its towpaths take you past locks, bridges and local neighbourhoods. Come for a romantic stroll, cycle, picnic lunch or dusk-time drink.



Château de Versailles

Amid magnificently landscaped formal gardens, this splendid and enormous palace was built in the mid-17th century during the reign of Louis XIV to project the absolute power of the French monarchy, which was then at the height of its glory. Years later, you can visit it and let your eyes feast on the magnificence of the gardens and building. Don't miss it!



Eiffel Tower

No one could imagine Paris today without it. But Gustave Eiffel only constructed this elegant, 320m-tall signature spire as a temporary exhibit for the 1889 World's Fair. Luckily, the art nouveau tower's popularity assured its survival. Prebook online to avoid painfully long ticket queues.



NIGHTLIFE



Opera National

The glorious Second Empire architecture of the Palais Garnier alone is a convincing reason to visit, with its multicoloured marble, imposing Grand Staircase, Grand Foyer and Chagall fresco. However, you'll stay for the incredible performances of the opera artists that take the stage of this impressive building. The opera house seats 22,200, with room for up to 450 performers on stage, and it's reason enough to dress smart and make this night out the most fancy you can make it.

Folies-Bergère

When the Folies-Bergère opened its doors in 1869, its revues set the mould for the Belle Époque era to come. It went on to host the greatest stars of the early 20th century, from Joséphine Baker to Charlie Chaplin. Today the sumptuous, velvet-bedecked space plays host to a diverse roster of dramatic and musical talent. You definitely can't miss visiting this incredible space.


Galeries Lafayette

Le Grand Restaurant

A bold and elegant modern style restaurant of a young chef (Jean-Francois Piège), just awarded 2 Michelin stars, is everything we could ever dream of. If you're an interior design lover, this restaurant is for you, offering you an harmonic and peaceful but youthful and modern ambiance with incredible marble walls and open kitchen, grey cement walls that works perfectly with the furniture, glass ceiling with geometric patterns, thick gray honeycomb-pattern carpeting, and beautiful dining chairs that are just as comfortable as they are sophisticated and colorful.

There is a fleet of flying-saucer-style chrome banquettes and an oversize hooded loveseat, creating a clean and daring look that gives us a certain 1960s retro-Futurist charm.




Restaurant David Toutain



After a makeover, this modern restaurant has become one of the most stylish new tables in Paris, and certainly a must visit for design lovers. 




Le Meurice

This hotel stands out on its own among the Paris palaces with its prime position on arcaded rue de Rivoli, just minutes from the Louvre. Grand and magnificent, it exudes luxury from every corner. There are chandeliers and marble galore but also a frosted mirror in the entrance hall where guests can doodle or sign their autograph. With stunning presidential suites and an amazing penthouse with a private lift with a 360° view from its rooftop terrace, it's a must-visit for all the luxury and interior design lovers.

Ritz Paris

Opened in 1898, this was the most innovative hotel in Paris at the time, the first to have lifts, electricity and private bathrooms. While it's true that times have changed, the Ritz hotel in Paris is still impressive on its own, with incredible interior design, luxury to its finest, an incredible costumer service and comfort, as well as a modernity to it despite having preserved its period furniture and paintings, preserving along with it a piece of French history.

Shangri-La Hotel

In this hotel, you will find a look into French culture and design. With an exquisite spa and indoor rooftop pool, this is an irresistible hotel with 188 guest rooms, many overlooking the beautiful inner courtyards, completely sound-proofed from the city noise to make you feel like you're far away, in a oasis of peace and relaxation. The rooms are feminine in style with fresh, floral fabrics, with coordinating bedspreads, and a classic mix of chandeliers, Regency-style furniture and neutrallytoned walls.

Four Seasons Hotel George V Paris
