Flua: the jugs that are vases

The Flua duo was born to poor drinks, hot or cold, but the truth is they also look great with a bunch of flowers! The name derives from Esperanto and means liquid.

Available in two sizes, they give a natural touch to every home. Made with earthenware with a cork lid they promise to elegantly keep any drink or flowers.



Designed by Sofia de Almeida Nunes, each jug is handmade and that's why every piece is unique.

Nukso: the nutcracker for the strongest

The name of this nutcracker also derives from Esperanto and simply means "walnut". The object was designed by Raphaël Costes, a French designer based in Iceland and founder of Innri Innri studio. This original object made in brass challenges the consumer to break walnuts using their own hands against Nukso.



To create Nukso, the designer collected a walnut from his hometown (Colmar in Alsace) that is now produced in brass in the west region of Portugal.

### A committed company

Patrícia Valinho founded Dedal to promote Portugal. The company was born from a double observation: first, more and more companies only focused on profit have been relocating their production centers to the BRIC zone, where respect for the environment and workers is not a priority.

This is how Dedal was born. 'dedal' is the acronym of DEveloping Design And Local economies. It also means thimble in Portuguese (the cap used to protect the end of the finger when sewing).
