MAK SUH MUH


Armchair

Playing with vivid colors and bold shapes, Malabar designers conceived a playful, artsy, and extravagant dining chair. Exclusively handcrafted in walnut wood by our expert artisans, the Mak Suh Muh dining chair is upholstered in different cotton velvet colors and patterns.

Abandoning all the rules/Freedom from rules of mixing patterns and shapes, this postmodern dining chair provides a new way of looking for the interior design world, where the authenticness is the key. MADONNA Stool



Always curious about new scientific discoveries, the atom become one of Salvador Dalí favorite subjects of reflexion. Dalí borrows the image of a Madonna by Raphael Sanzio to conceived the Maximum Speed of Raphael's Madonna. Her breaks up into spheres, geometrically perfect figures, and into forms resembling rhinoceros horns as Dalí unearths logarithmic spiral forms based on the pattern of Divine Proportion.

Inspired by the so-called "atomic period" of Dalí, Malabar designers conceived the Madonna stool. This art-filled stool features four Verde Guatemala marble spheres feet and two jacquard velvet upholstered layers. This art-inspired stool will enhance your interiors by placing our art-stool at select vantage points in your home décor.

GALATEA

Know for his surrealist paintings, Salvador Dalí was one of the most controversial and paradoxical artists of the twenty century. Over the last decades, alongside Picasso and Matisse, Dalí has gradually come to be seen as a prodigious figure whose life and work occupy a central and unique position in the history of modern art.

Painting by Dali in 1952, the Galatea of Spheres depicts Gala Dalí, his wife and muse. This surrealist painting as pieced together through a series of spheres arranged in a continuous array.

Playing with scales and spheres, Malabar designers conceived with artistry this future classic armchair. Handcrafted with expertise by artisans, the Galatea armchair features an asymmetrical design composed by two different feet, a black and gold sphere and a rectangular walnut wood shape. LA JOIE Mirror

Inspired by the evocation a more psychological reflection on couple life's joys of the painting, where hands touch, Malabar designers conceived this art looker.


To be attached vertically to the walls, the oval La Joie mirror creates a play of reflections and light, handmade in polished brass and aged bronze mirror.

Mirror



Vincent Van Gogh, the famous post-impressionist painter, found his place in art and produced emotional, visually arresting paintings over a decade.

Painted by memory, the Starry Night is one of the masterpieces inherited from the misunderstood artist Vincent Van Gogh. Although the painting shows the outside view at night from the window of the Saint Rémy de Provence just before sunrise, the work was painted during the day by heart. And nowadays it's one of the most famous paintings ever.

So inspired by the impressionist movement, Malabar designers conceived this artsy mirror like it was spontaneously painted to capture the impression of the light in a scene. Conceptual yet functional, the art-filled round mirror combines in harmony irregular shapes of three exquisite materials, such as polished hammered brass, Carrara marble, and lacquered wood finished with high gloss varnish. The art-inspired Starry Mirror will be a future classic adornment in your home décor.
