We know that bio-waste is one of the biggest enemies of the environment. It accounts for 34% of all waste and 57% of food waste is not recycled at all. It ends up in mixed waste and releases greenhouse gases into the atmosphere, the consequences of which we must not overlook.



Each and every one of us produces bio-waste every day. In the last two years, the covid-19 pandemic has caused an increased amount of food waste produced by households by as much as seven percent. Less has been recycled, and the management of bio-waste in biogas and composting plants has decreased by nine percent. These are the figures for Slovenia published by the Slovene Statistics Office. Awareness and knowledge about the appropriate management of bio-waste seem to be even more important in light of these facts.



For all of you who are interested in the issue of bio-waste and want to take a responsible approach to tackle this global problem, Skaza presents the Bokashi Academy. It is meant for all of you who are aware that proper management of bio-waste starts at home, on every kitchen counter. By following the content offered at the Bokashi Academy, you will learn how to use solutions such as the Organko Daily waste bin and the Bokashi Organko composter correctly in the waste management cycle. "Our wish in the future is to build a global community that would share experiences and best practices in the management of bio-waste and the reasonable use of resources created after composting," explains Jelena Rašula, the leader of the Bokashi Academy project and Digital Project Manager at Skaza, on the occasion of the launching of the academy.
