Eurasian Teal (WG4474)

The Eurasian teal's scientific name is considered sound-imitating and refers to the male's sound in the spring, "kriick". Carl von Linné first described this little waterfowl in 1758 in Systema Naturae. It is widely spread through Europe and Asia, and the summer and winter ranges overlap in some areas.

Northern Flicker (WG4677)

The northern flicker is common in North America and in parts of Central America and the West Indies. They are one of the few migratory woodpeckers and have an unusual habit of feeding directly on the ground, pecking for beetles, ants, and the odd invertebrate. Their nesting habits also differ from other woodpeckers, and they happily reuse tree hollows that both the male and female take part in furnishing.
