PHYSALIS
(WG4703)

Physalis (aka groundcherry, husk tomato, husk cherry, poh berry or golden berry) belongs to the nightshade family (like potato and tomato). They are native to the Americas and Australasia. There is a significant trade in physalis fruits in Colombia, India and Mexico.



STAR ANISE
(WG4704)

Illicium verum is an evergreen tree native to Vietnam and southwest China, and many use its star-shaped pericarps as a spice—star anise. Star anise features in different types of cuisine worldwide, such as Chinese "five-spice" and even French mulled wine.



POPPY
(WG4705)

Poppies are beautiful plants with stems up to a meter tall, and some have flowers up to 15 cm wide. Many cultivate them for their ornamental value. However, some varieties have edible seeds rich in oil, carbohydrates, calcium and protein. Some types are even grown for their use in medicinal drug production.

WHEAT
(WG4706)

Wheat is a grass and a cereal grain that is a staple food worldwide. It is grown on more land area than any other food crop, but in output weight, it is second after maize (2020). Mexico's International Maize and Wheat Improvement Center (CIMMYT) is at the forefront of international wheat breeding.
