The monolithic form showcases the pure beauty of each stone's metamorphosis, creating poetic textures and stories. With a curved seat for added comfort, it draws inspiration from archaic period's objects, hence the name Thebes.

The durability of stone makes it ideal for both indoor and outdoor use, while it effortlessly integrates into contemporary spaces. It comes in two versions – a low-back chair and a stool – with finish options in Rosso Verona, Travertino, Bianco Carrara, or Nero Marquina.




