True to its name, meaning ‘balance’ in Japanese, Heiko strikes a perfect balance between form and function. The soft lines and carefully balanced proportions add a sense of tranquillity to any room, whether placed around the dining table, in the corner of a bedroom, or by the desk in a home office.

Designed to serve more than a practical purpose, Heiko is an object of reflection – an embodiment of thoughtful design and cultural resonance. Available in oak and walnut, the chair brings together comfort, craftsmanship, and a serene design language that invites stillness and appreciation.
