

## **FRESH.GLASS to Debut Its Own Stand at Maison&Objet Paris**

From 15 to 19 January 2026, the international design fair Maison&Objet will take place at Parc des Expositions de Paris-Nord Villepinte. For the first time, FRESH.GLASS will appear on the international stage in an independent format, presenting its own stand at the fair.

FRESH.GLASS is already well known within the international professional community. In 2023, the studio participated in Collectible Brussels, PAD Paris, and Venice Glass Week, where it was awarded the Autonomia Residency Prize. In 2025, FRESH.GLASS works were presented as part of Paris Design Week.

FRESH.GLASS is a multidisciplinary brand exploring the nature of glass in all its manifestations. The studio rethinks fused glass as a durable, sustainable, and multifunctional material. Through its objects, FRESH.GLASS conveys a sensory and physical experience of interaction with matter. Experimentation lies at the core of the studio's methodology. Working with a multi-stage kiln glass casting technique, glass is fired at high temperatures, enabling deep engagement with the material. Sensation is a key category for the artistic collective: by listening to the glass, the team creates architectural elements, objects, sculptures, and installations across three main directions:

At Maison&Objet, FRESH.GLASS will present, on an unprecedented scale, one of its three core directions — #FRESH.GLASS.DESIGN.

#FRESH.GLASS.DESIGN

This direction focuses on the creation of conceptual serial design objects. Its mission is to make pieces produced through the complex, multi-stage artistic and applied technique of kiln glass casting more technological and accessible for integration into contemporary spaces. Tables and lighting objects become expressive artistic accents where tactile aesthetics meet refined functionality. The collections are easily integrated into interior and architectural projects, entering into dialogue with space. Each FRESH.GLASS.DESIGN object is an autonomous sculpture, offering an experience of aesthetic interaction in everyday life.

Experimenting with light, reflections, and the inner play of glass, FRESH.GLASS will unveil a new unique color at the fair — matte grey. Here, glass does not seek to

dazzle with shine; its depth is hidden within. The matte, velvety surface absorbs and softly diffuses light.

## SVETOVOI STOLB

At Maison&Objet, FRESH.GLASS will present the SVETOVOI STOLB lighting collection for the first time in all available sizes and colors. The series consists of luminous objects made of matte glass that can transform from architectural elements into floor lamps, wall lights, or even benches. The name refers to an atmospheric optical phenomenon — a *light pillar*, when a dense vertical beam of light rises above its source. The integrated light source emphasizes the flowing matte edges of the glass. Thanks to the material's strength, the light pillars can also be used horizontally, functioning as seating. Multiple elements can be combined into light installations, transforming spatial architecture and bringing it closer to a natural landscape.

## CALMAR Shelving

The modular shelving system from the CALMAR collection appears in space like a mirage, drawing the eye and inviting touch with its velvety surface. The modules can be combined or used individually, flipped and adapted to different functions — as a coffee table, console, or autonomous sculptural object.

## COROBA

COROBA is a series of hybrid multifunctional objects that can function as a side table or console, pouf or bench, as well as a storage system. The elements are easily combined and stacked, allowing transformation of space architecture while maintaining a minimalist aesthetic. A thick layer of glass attracts the eye with its depth, while matte, transparent, or black oily surfaces create a rich tactile experience. The combination of powerful glass with noble metal, which changes its character over time, enhances the sense of a living material. Light softly refracts, reflecting in smooth and wavy surfaces, encouraging touch.

## FF BLOCKS

The FF BLOCKS series of sculptures made from fused crystal glass reveals the inner silence and depth of the material. Variations in thickness and light refraction create different degrees of transparency across the facets. The softened block forms reference natural structures. Working with mass becomes a way to explore the internal life of glass, observing bubbles, swirls, and fine white threads as a choreography unfolding within the material.

## JELLYFISH

JELLYFISH is a collection of luminous wall panels that seem to grow out of the wall, evoking a living underwater organism. The internally glowing matte surface invites touch, while the curled edge of fused glass reveals the material's physics. Glass, caught at the moment of melting, preserves traces of movement through the studio's experience and craftsmanship. JELLYFISH can be produced as a wall sconce or as a double form resembling an oyster shell or a jellyfish. The double version can also be suspended from the ceiling.

### OIOIO Modular Wall Lights

The OIOIO collection has already gained international recognition and brought FRESH.GLASS the prestigious Autonomia Residency Prize for "a new reading of glass" at Venice Glass Week 2023. The series includes modular wall lights made from granulated recycled glass with a white, matte, velvety texture. The soft geometry of six models allows for dozens of minimalist compositions. Each element can be used independently or combined with others. OIOIO lights are created from recycled glass left over from previous projects and experiments. High-temperature kiln casting forms the distinctive velvety surface inside the mold. This complex glass-melting technique — Pâte de Verre — requires exceptional precision, patience, and deep immersion in the process, and is traditionally highly valued by Japanese and Chinese glass masters.
