

Park Avenue Returns to the Heart of the Ville Lumière

Park Avenue returns as a protagonist at Maison&Objet, bringing with it its own identity capable of expressing itself through the details of its creations. A sensibility that perfectly aligns with that of the Parisian event, which this year, with the theme “Past Reveals Future,” explores a concept very dear to the Tuscan brand: reinterpreting the past in a contemporary key.

At the heart of the inspiration remains an everlasting New York, which in the 1920s embraced modernity by playing with geometries and sinuous lines. The same that we find in the furniture solutions designed by Park Avenue.

Mira

This year's new addition to the Park Avenue catalogue is **Mira**. This bathroom console takes its name from Latin, meaning *admirable*, *marvellous*, *extraordinary*, and recalls the allure of the Roaring Twenties—so central to the brand's aesthetic and mood. With references to the elegant rigour of Art Deco, Mira blends retro-inspired exotic influences with modern, essential functionality.

Characterised by clean, disciplined lines, it stands out for its brass base structure and for the decorated aluminium cladding of its doors, finished with a perimeter brass frame and a matching brass handle. The Japanese-style front decorations, available in four variants, enhance the doors, making them both practical and refined. Noteworthy details include the finely crafted MDF carcass and the back-painted glass top with an undermount basin.

Mira is available in three versions: 3S – 163 cm, 2S – 128 cm, and 1S – 67 cm.
